Specific issues examined are Ethnicity, Gender, Family, Education, Religion, Government, Economy, Health and Illness.

- Understand how theories inform substantive areas of current sociological topics.
- Identify and describe the main sources of social change.
- Analyze the spread and effects of mass education in the United States.
